## The Terminal Generation



## *1 Corinthians 15:47-58*

Several books on prophecy have been titled,

"The Terminal Generation." "Terminal" means "constituting the end of a period." The present period of time, lasting for almost 2000 years, may rightly be referred to as the Church Age. During this time, the Lord Jesus has been building His Church (*Matt. 16:18*), adding to it daily such as should be saved (*Acts 2:47*).

God has been visiting the Gentile nations in order to take out a people for His Name (*Acts 15:14*). This building program will be terminated when the full number of Gentiles are incorporated into the Body of Christ (*Rom. 11:25*). The expression "fullness of the Gentiles" does not exclude Jews from the body of Christ, but merely points to the fact that the overwhelming majority of believers in this Church Age are Gentiles.

Paul revealed that there will be a whole generation of believers who will not see physical death (*1 Cor. 15:51-52*), but instead will be caught up as a group, along with Church saints who have already died, to meet the Lord in the air (*1 Thess. 4:13-18*). In God's building program, we might consider ourselves in the steeple stage. As our godless world prepares for a one world government, the final living stones (*1 Pet. 2:5*) will soon be added to complete the building. The period characterized by grace will end; and the period characterized by wrath will begin, although God will certainly show His grace even during the time of wrath.

Some day, perhaps very soon, the last person of this Age will believe on Christ. Then, in a **moment** ("atom") of time, all believers will be removed from earth. Whether or not this event takes place in our lifetime, the fact remains that our time on earth is short. May we faithfully serve our Master, and may souls be reached with the gospel!
