Humility Personified

Philippians 2:3-11

Humility's watchword is "*Not I, But Christ!*" (*Gal. 2:20*). Humility counts on the fact that his sinful self has died, and that his life is now identified with the risen Christ who is his life (*Rom. 6:11*).

HUMILITY:

Remembers the pit from which he was rescued (*Isa. 51:1; Psalm 40:1; Eph. 2:11-12*).

■ Is aware of his spiritual poverty and bankruptcy (*Matt. 5:3; Job* 40:4) and that he is an unprofitable servant (*Luke 17:10*).

■ Is glad to decrease that Christ might increase (*John 3:30*).

Refuses to exalt himself, choosing rather to take the lowest place when necessary (*Luke 18:14*).

Looks not on his own things, but on the things of others (*Phil.* 2:4).

■ Is careful not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think (*Rom. 12:3*).

Finds greatness in serving others (*Mark 10:43-44*).

Does not please himself, but he seeks to please his neighbor for his good to edification (*Rom. 15:1-2*).

Does not seek his own things, but the things that are Jesus Christ's (*Phil. 2:21*).

Does not delight in being seen by men in a favorable light (*Matt. 6:5*), but he is willing to be scorned and abused by men as long as God is glorified (*Matt. 5:10-12*).

 Is pleased to do seemingly insignificant acts of service even when such deeds go unseen and unnoticed by others (*Luke 16:10*).

• Would rather abide with the lowly than to share riches with the proud (*Prov. 16:19*).

Does not exercise himself in great matters, or in things that are too high for him (*Psalm 131:1-2*).

His close companion is the fear of the LORD (*Prov. 22:4*).

Lets others praise him, and not his own mouth (*Prov. 27:2*).

■ Rejoices when God is praised and loves to boast in the LORD, who alone is worthy (*Psalm 34:2*).
