Here are but some of the contributing factors:

+ 1) The Ten Commandments are rarely being taught to our young people, including the sixth command: "Thou shalt not murder."

+ 2) A large percentage of Americans do not attend church services regularly and sadly most churches do not faithfully preach the Bible.

+ 3) Capital punishment (*Gen. 9:6*) is not practiced in America; murderers are not put to death. The purpose of capital punishment was to remove the murderer from the earth and to cause others to fear.

↓ 4) There is a breakdown of the family unit with children born out of wedlock, children with absent fathers, etc.

+ 5) There is a diminishing respect for human life. Most are horrified by young children being shot, but many have no problem with the cruel slaughter of the unborn.

+ 6) Most children are not taught values by loving parents but get their education from social media, television and Hollywood movies which abound in violence and filth. Children are not trained to focus on that which true, honest, just, pure, and lovely (*Phil. 4:8*).

+ 7) The depravity of man is expressed with few external restraints: "Their feet are swift to shed blood, destruction and misery are in their ways; and the way of peace have they not known" (*Rom. 3:14-17*).

+8) The ultimate problem is a spiritual one: "There is no fear of God before their eyes" (*Rom. 3:18*).
